

Editorial Page



Lecturer appointed to board of Cork Simon





At a special meeting of the Cork Simon Community on Monday 19 September, **Dr Emmanuelle Schön-Quinlivan** of the Department of Government was formally ratified as a new board member.

Cork Simon Community works in solidarity with men and women who are homeless, offering housing and support in their journey back to independent or supported living. Every night Cork Simon provides over 100 beds for people in Cork who are homeless.

The range of Cork Simon's accommodation services and supports includes:

- Emergency Shelter offering safe, secure accommodation and one-to-one support for 50 men and women every night of the year
- Day Centre critical support for men and women sleeping rough, offering direct access to a team of doctors, nurses and counsellors
- Outreach Team working directly with men and women sleeping rough, linking them into mainstream services and offering care and support
- High-Support Housing permanent accommodation for 32 men and women with mental and/or physical health needs at four residential houses across the city
- Housing Plus -empowering people to return to independent-living in Cork Simon's 25 apartments, in social housing and in the private rented sector, offering a level of support appropriate to each person's needs
- Soup Run Cork Simon's original project that continues to be operated year-round by a team of 40 volunteers, offering nourishing food, befriending and support every night to people sleeping rough
- Training helping to build the skills and confidence necessary for independent living

Fiona Buckley of the Department of Government has been extremely active lately in terms of research output and conference presentations. Here is a sample of what she has been up to.

- She recently presented a paper examining women in cabinet government at the General Conference of the ECPR (European Consortium for Political Research) in Reykjavik, Iceland.
- She presented at the 'Women into Public Life' seminar in Letterkenny on Friday 30 September.



- She will be presenting at the annual conference of the Irish Federation for University Women (8 October) in River Lee Hotel. Students are welcome to attend. 
