





Distributed research groups and the remote supervision of research students

The move to online teaching in March 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic was accompanied by the need for academics to continue existing research collaborations and ensure continuity in the supervision of research students. In this talk, we will discuss collaborations involving research students carried out remotely both pre- and postlockdown from the perspective of research in stochastic numerical analysis, an area of mathematics that combines theoretical analysis and computational work.

We will base our discussion on examples that include the joint supervision by researchers in Ireland and the Netherlands of a PhD student based in the UK, and the remote supervision of dissertation projects for a graduate programme in mathematics offered by the African Institute for Mathematical Sciences in Senegal.
