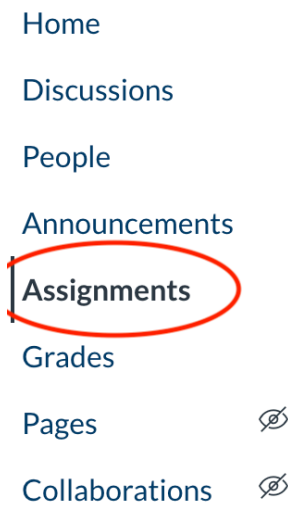
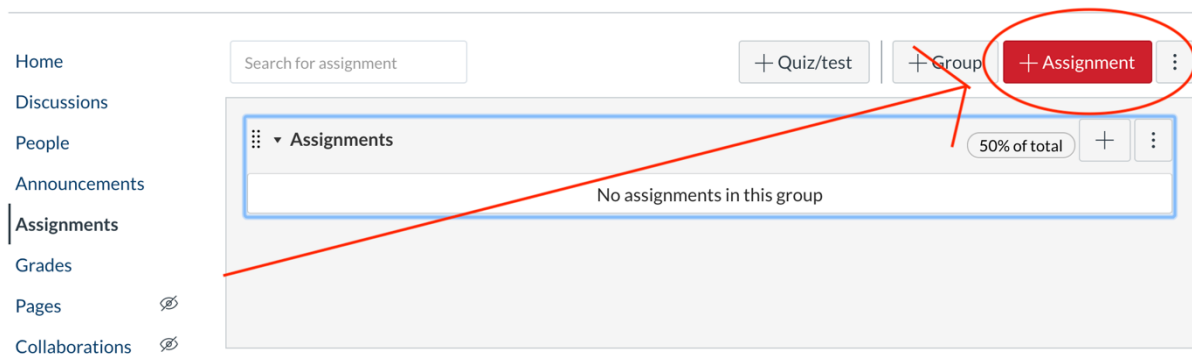


## How to Create a Turnitin Assignment in Canvas




