1	<p>Age Action</p> <p>https://www.ageaction.ie/ National support organisation for older people</p>	<p>Idea for research project:</p> <p>Most housing associations in Ireland receive funding through the Capital Assistance Scheme. Under this scheme they can accept 100 per cent of funding from the State in which case they have to take 100 per cent of clients off the waiting lists. Or, they can accept 95 per cent funding and they must take at least 75 per cent of clients off the waiting list.</p> <p>Our proposed research would examine the possibility of a scheme whereby older owner-occupiers could sell their home, thus freeing up housing stock, and use the proceeds from the sale to 'buy in' to a housing association project. The association would then be able to use the funds received through the sale of the older person's property to invest in building new homes.</p> <p>The research would need to examine the feasibility of such a scheme and also assess the implications it might have for the housing waiting list by enabling those not on the waiting list to 'jump the queue' because they own their own property. A central part of the research would be to conduct primary research with older people to explore their views on any proposed changes to policy and their thoughts on downsizing.</p>

Evaluate if sail training can influence and initiate psychological change in people recovering from addiction? People recovering from addiction usually face difficulties or are lacking in self-esteem, communication skills, working in a team and responsibility in selfcare, to learn and to be involved which all affect in their ability to fit into society. There are indicators pointing out that sailing as such promote and support the skills and abilities mentioned above. However, more research is needed to understand what are the processes that bring the mentioned outcomes. 2. Explore different models of how Sailing into Wellness could be sponsored by corporations as part of their CSR programs. At the moment the sponsorship model is built so that each employee the company pays to attend a sailing experience, funds one person from a youth and community group or person in recovery. However, we want to develop other models of co-operation, that could be interesting for companies. Perhaps there are certain industries that would be more interested than others and sponsoring SIW might offer various ways for company to be socially responsible.

We wish to develop a greater understanding of the demographics of ageing and housing in Cork City to inform our service provision. “Understanding the changing population and housing demographics for Ageing in Cork City: a study of the current and potential clients of SHARE” 2. Measure SHARE's impact on the life quality and well-being of the older people we serve. “A case study on the impact of the SHARE sheltered-housing and day centre provision”.

The social care board within CORU is in place to progress the process.</p>	<p>Idea for research project:</p> <p>We are seeking to further research the statistics emerging from a study of “Violence in the Workplace” (2016) as it relates to social care workers in the Disability sector.</p> <p>20% (disability service workers) of over 430 respondents in 2016 survey (Crisis, Concern and Complacency by Phil Keogh and Catherine Byrne) noted significant levels of violence in the social care workplace in general.</p> <p>If this statistic among social care disability sector workers were to be replicated in a wider (countrywide) survey then it would really open up a problem that may well have remained hidden, i.e., there may be widespread levels of violence towards social care workers in that sector.</p>
14	<p><u>St Michael’s Centre, Bandon</u></p> <p>A resource Centre for Older People living in Bandon and the wider area.</p>	<p>Idea for research project:</p> <p>As part of its strategic planning activity, the centre seeks to partner with students in research to undertake a Listening Exercise in its network of social groups and individuals who use the centre. The purpose of the Listening Exercise is to gather ideas and perspectives from older people on how they want to be supported in their communities and to contribute to communities in the long-term. The results of the Listening Exercise will be used to inform objectives and priorities in the strategic plan.</p>
