

Continuing Professional Development in Freshwater Quality Monitoring and Assessment

GEMS/Water CDC Bursary

Each Bursary is worth €100 and can be awarded to students who have been nominated by their National Focal Point (NFP) or from GEMS/Water GPCU and applied to commence one of the following modules : EV6012, EV6013, EV6014, EV6015, EV6016 and EV6017. Awards to the value of the tuition fees for one module will be paid directly to the Fees Office of University College Cork. Students will need to meet the following criteria to be eligible for a bursary:

- The applicant must have applied and been accepted for their chosen course
- Each applicant must have provided a nomination letter from their GEMS/Water National Focal Point (NFP) or GEMS/Water GPCU for the reduced fees

Awardees will need to make satisfactory progress during the course, including meeting the necessary pass and progress standards otherwise you may have to reimburse the university for the cost.

Meeting the criteria above does not guarantee an applicant an award.

Applicants should complete the statement page below outlining the significance of undertaking the module in Freshwater Quality Monitoring and Assessment and the potential benefit to their organization as a result of the applicant completing the course.
