# The Southern Cultural Experience Spring 2019

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#### 1. Course Overview

This module allows for international exchange students to experience the major qualities that make the American South a distinct region, during their study at FMU. The course is organized using *The FMU Passport Experience*, which lists student trips and activities that are to be completed during a semester of foreign study at FMU. In some cases, discipline-oriented faculty will accompany exchange students on group travel experiences, while students will use their FMU Passports to complete individual cultural experiences in other cases. Upon completion, students should be able to identify key characteristics that distinguish Southern culture within the broader American context.

### 3. Grading Scale and Composition

This course is graded on a satisfactory (S) / unsatisfactory (U) basis, where students who have completed the requisite number of Passport activities will be awarded a grade of S and 3.0 FMU credit hours, as stipulated by the INTS 299 listing in the current *Catalog*.

## 4. Course Eligibility

This course is only available to incoming exchange students on an official FMU exchange program. Registration is facilitated with the permission of the International Programs faculty. Students who register for the INTS 299 credit will receive 3.0 FMU credit hours upon successful completion, but may only apply these hours in addition to a full-time (12.0 credit hours) program of study.

If the 3.0 credit hours from INTS 299 exceed the normal maximum of 17.0 credit hours per semester, students may petition to the Provost's Office to be permitted to register for the 3.0 additional hours.

Students on a year-long exchange program may re-take INTS 299 in the second semester.

## 4. Course Requirements:

- The South in Comparison: FMU Honors or Model UN trip to Philadelphia, Washington, or New York
