ARTS SUBJECTS & SUBJECT GROUPS TABLES

The College of Arts, Celtic Studies and Social Sciences at UCC offers a wide range of subjects. Depending on the course, you will be able to choose one or more subjects.

Table 1 opposite, shows the full choice of subjects available to you within each group. No more than one subject may be chosen from any individual group. Subjects within the same group cannot be combined. If you study CK101 Arts or CK108 Arts International, all subject groups will be available to you in choosing your subjects. If you study another Arts course certain groups/subjects will be available to you but not all. In Table 2 below, you can see what subject groups or individual subjects are on offer within each course. Remember, you can only pick one subject from each group as shown in Table 1. For example If you want to study Music with Maths; Film with Philosophy; Criminology with Irish and many other combinations, then you will have the flexibility to

ARTS SUBJECTS REQUIREMENTS WITH POINTS TO NOTE

All Subjects

A Lab Science is not required for any Arts, Celtic Studies and Social Science course **Applied Mathematics**

Students who wish to take Applied Mathematics must have achieved at least H3 in Mathematics in the Leaving Certificate (or equivalent). Students taking Applied Mathematics in First Arts must also take Mathematics (MA1055). Applied Mathematics may not be combined with Mathematical Studies (MS1002, MS1004). Note that Applied Mathematics will no longer be offered as an Arts subject from 2025/26.

Béaloideas

Students wishing to select Béaloideas should normally have a minimum grade H4 in Irish in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent). Lectures are through the medium of Irish. Students may not take both Béaloideas and Folklore. Students intending to apply to transfer to the BA (International) and take Chinese Studies or continental languages, at a Single, Major or Joint subject in Second Year, should note that they cannot register for Béaloideas in Second Year.

Chinese Studies

This subject is available in First Arts and thereafter as a 10-credit subject in the Single Subject Programme or as a 20-credit subject in the Major Subject Programme in the three year BA Degree. Students wishing to continue with Chinese Studies as a 30- or 40-credit subject must make an application seeking the approval of CACSSS to transfer to the BA (International). All such applications are subject to examination results and availability of places. These students will spend the third year of their degree studying at an approved university in China and return to UCC to complete their degree programme in Fourth Year.

Computer Studies

This is available in First Arts and thereafter only as a 10-credit subject within the Single Subject Degree Programme.

This subject is available in First Arts and thereafter only as part of the BA (International). European Studies students wishing to transfer to the four-year BA (Hons) International must make an application seeking the approval of CACSSS. All such applications are subject to examination

A student will not normally be allowed to select French unless they have attained a pass standard in French in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent).

Students wishing to select **German NonBeginners** should have a minimum H4 in German in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent). Students wishing to take **German (Beginners)** are recommended to have a minimum of H3 in another modern continental language, or itish, or Latin, or Greek in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent). Students will be accepted to the Beginners group only if they have no prior German, or if they have reached a level no higher than Junior Certificate German.

This is available in First Arts and thereafter only as a 10-credit subject in the Single Subject

History of Art History of Art may be taken with another subject in Group 2 in First Year only

Italian

Students wishing to take **Beginners' Italian** are recommended to have a minimum of Grade H4 in another modern continental language, or Irish, or Latin, or Greek in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent). Students wishing to take **NonBeginners' Italian** are recommended have a minimum of H4 in Italian in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent).

This is available in First Arts and thereafter only as a 10-credit subject in the Single Subject programme

Mathematics (a)

Students who wish to take Mathematics must have achieved at least a H3 in Mathematics in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent). Students who have passed M51002, M81003 and M51004 may not register for MA1055 in a repeat year. This subject may not be combined with Celtic Civilisation or Spanish in First Arts due to timetable restrictions. Note that Mathematics will no longer be offered as an Arts subject from 2025/26.

Mathematical Studies (b)

Students who have passed MAI055 may not register for MSI002, MSI003 and MSI004 in a repeat year. Note that Mathematical Studies will have new entry requirements from 2025/26 and students will be required to achieve a minimum H4 in Mathematics in the Leaving Cert.

Portuguese

Students wishing to take **Beginners' Portuguese** must have obtained a minimum H4 in the Leaving Certificate (or equivalent) in another modern continental language, or Irish, Latin or Greek.

Students wishing to take **Beginners' Spanish** must have obtained a minimum H4 in the Leaving Certificate (or equivalent) in another modern continental language, or Irish, Latin or Greek OR evidence of competence equivalent to Grade H4 in a foreign language other than Spanish. Students who have studied Spanish at second level and obtained a Grade below H4 can also join the **Beginners' Spanish** course. Students wishing to take **NonBeginners' Spanish** must have obtained a minimum Grade H4 in Spanish in the Leaving Certificate Examination (or equivalent).

Studies in Music

This is available in First Arts and thereafter as a 10-credit subject in the Single Subject

Theatre and Performative Practices

Students who wish to take Theatre and Performative Practices with Music must also complete the Music audition as part of the Theatre admission process.

Work Experience Module

Our Professional Work Experience Module (PX3001) is an accredited professional work experience module that allows CACSSS students to explore and develop their career interests. This optional module can be undertaken during any year of the undergraduate degree.

Eligible applications compete for a place in either one or both of the following supplementary admissions schemes:

HEAR (Higher Education Access Route)

Open to school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged

DARE (Disability Access Route to Education)

Open to school leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their second level education.

CAO DATES

6 November: Online application open

20 January: Discounted application fee deadline

1 February: Normal application deadline

1 May: Late application deadline (does not include application for restricted courses)

5 May: 'Change of Mind' opens

1 July: 'Change of Mind' closes

QQI/FET STUDENTS

Students with appropriate QQI/FET qualifications, with distinctions in specific awards and modules, may be admitted on a competitive basis to a number of UCC degree programmes.

MATURE STUDENTS

To be eligible to compete for a place as a mature student, you must be 23 years of age on or before 1 January of the application year and apply via cao.ie by 1 February. Check out the CAO website for more information on the application process as a mature student. Some programmes require UCC-specific entrance tests, and others have specific educational requirements, so it is essential that you check the UCC Mature Student Office website ucc.le/mature or contact our Mature Student Advisor for further details at mso@ucc.ie.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

MINIMUM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are minimum entry requirements that all applicants must meet. They are known as matriculation requirements.

For all programmes at UCC, you will need to obtain a minimum Grade H5 in two subjects and minimum Grade O6/H7 in the remaining four subjects. For all courses in UCC, this must include Irish and English.

A pass in Irish (O6/H7) in the Leaving Certificate is required for admission to all courses in UCC. However, certain applicants may be eligible for an exemption from this requirement from the NUI (for example, those born outside the Republic of Ireland).

HOW TO CALCULATE YOUR POINTS

Points are calculated based on the six best recognised subjects taken at one examination sitting.

To compete for a place on a programme, you must meet the minimum entry requirements as well as any specific/additional requirements, and then compete based on results obtained, e.g. Leaving Certificate points. You can combine results achieved in different sittings for the purpose of meeting the minimum entry requirements for programmes (except for Medicine, CK701). However, results achieved in separate years may not be combined for the purpose of scoring points.

A bonus of 25 points is allocated to students who achieve a $\operatorname{\textbf{grade}}$ H6 or above in Higher Level Maths.

LCVP can be counted for points scoring purposes only and cannot be counted as one of the six subjects to satisfy minimum entry requirements

Other language (in addition to English and Irish) is a requirement for all programmes at UCC with the exception of all programmes in our college of Science, Engineering and Food Science, Nursing programmes and the BSc Medical and Health Sciences.

Foundation Level Mathematics is accepted for matriculation but does not meet the requirement for degrees where Mathematics is a special programme requirement. Points are not awarded for the subject.

Foundation Level Irish is not accepted for matriculation. Points are not awarded for the subject.

EU/EFTA/UK APPLICANTS

If you are from EU/EFTA/UK then you will apply via the Central Applications Office (CAO) system, like Irish Leaving Certificate school leavers.

APPLICANTS FROM OUTSIDE EUROPE

If you are from outside the EU/EFTA/UK, you will make your application via UCC's online application system 'UCCApply,' which can be accessed at the 'How Do I Apply' section of the **ucc.le/ugi** page. Applications open in early December and traditionally close at the end of May. There is an application fee of €50 which will allow you to apply for a maximum of two programmes per application.



You will need to provide supporting documents as outlined in the Supporting Documents Checklist section at **ucc.ie/ugi**

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

We accept a wide range of qualifications for entry. Applications will be considered from applicants whose qualifications are equivalent to the Irish Leaving Certificate and will be considered on a case-by-case basis. For Non-EU (International) admission to undergraduate studies at UCC, our programmes are categorised into 3 bands of competitiveness. Consult the Entry Requirements section of the **ucc.ie/ugi** page as that contains region-specific information. The Entry Requirements section also explains the Cambridge GCE A Levels and International Baccalaureate qualification requirements.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

If you are an international applicant whose first language is not English, you must provide evidence of equivalent competence in the English language.

OTHER USEFUL INFORMATION

DEFERRED ENTRY POLICY

Students who have been offered a place in UCC through the CAO system may be permitted, on application to the UCC Admissions Officer, to defer first year entry for one year, however it is not always possible to defer entry. Deferred Entry requests are considered on a case-by-case basis and a range of factors are considered, including programme quota, the nature of the offer and the reasons set out by the applicant. Any application for Deferred Entry being made on medical grounds should be accompanied by a letter or certificate from a doctor. There is no guarantee that a Deferred Entry application will be approved in any circumstance.

Should you receive an offer and then be seeking a deferral, it is important to follow the CAO's guidelines and not accept the offered place in the CAO system. Complete and submit the UCC's Deferred Entry Request Form immediately but no later than two days before the reply date shown on the CAO Offer Notice.

MINIMUM AGE

CAO applicants for full-time degrees must normally have reached 17 years of age by the 15 January of the year following entry to UCC. If you are younger than this, you can make a special application for exemption from the age requirement. Applications must be made in writing to the UCC Admissions Officer and should be accompanied by a letter of support from the School Principal and a parent/guardian.

STUDENT GARDA VETTING

For some degree programmes, a condition of enrolment is that incoming students have cleared the vetting process in accordance with university policy and the National Vetting Bureau (Children and Vulnerable Persons)

INFECTIOUS DISEASE SCREENING AND IMMUNISATION POLICY

Health are at increased risk of contracting and transmitting certain infectious diseases, as a result of being in a clinical environment as part of their course. In order to protect both our students and their patients, if you enrol in the School of Nursing and Midwifery, you will be screened and immunised by the Health Service Executive Occupational Health Service and you will be subject to the HSE policies in this regard. All other undergraduate students in the College of Medicine and Health are subject to the UCC Infectious Disease Screening and Blood Borne Virus Policy. This policy requires applicants to forward details of their immunisation and medical history to the Student Health Department once they have received an offer of a place on their course.

CK701 MEDICINE - CAO APPLICANTS

CAO applicants are required to achieve a minimum of 480 Leaving Certificate points and meet the minimum subject requirements for matriculation in the same sitting of the Leaving Certificate or equivalent. Students are also required to present the required Admissions Test (HPAT-Ireland) completed in the year of entry to the Medicine programme. Applicants must make a separate application to HPAT-Ireland to sit this exam. The maximum possible points score for applicants to medicine is 565. Scores above 550 are moderated and added to the HPAT-Ireland scores.

CK701 MEDICINE AND CK702 DENTISTRY - APPLICANTS FROM OUTSIDE EUROPE

Applications for Medicine and Dentistry can only be made through designated UCC Agents. Each Agent has a specific closing date. You will need to contact the relevant Agent for information on the application procedure and closing dates.

CK104 ARTS-MUSIC AND CK112 THEATRE AND PERFORMATIVE PRACTICES

Applicants are required to sit an entrance exam, which they will be called for automatically and which is normally held in April each year. For CK112, this entrance exam will be marked out of 100 and these points will be added to the School Leaving Examination points to make up a final score. Students who wish to take CK112 Theatre & Performative Practices with Music must also complete the Music audition - details will be provided as part of Theatre admission's process. CK104 Arts-Music is graded on a pass/fail basis. Late CAO applications after 1 February are not accepted for these programmes as they are restricted entry programmes.
