

MA in History

The University College Cork Masters in History is a 12-month programme (24-months part-time).

It offers unique flexibility and diversity: four separate streams, eighteen modules, plus optional work placement and optional Latin language course. Streams range from Medieval and Renaissance History to Modern Ireland or Media and History or International and European History.


You select from diverse topics, such as revolution and regime change, collective memory and commemoration, cultural heritage, the medieval world, Ireland's relationships and encounters with the wider world, identity, nationalism, the evolution of healthcare, radicalism and social unrest, the historical uses and applications of modern media, war and peace, booms and busts since the dawn of modern finance, contemporary history, US foreign relations or feminist history. Students have the opportunity to:

- Examine the relationship between collective memory and identity and history
- Critically appreciate the manipulation, uses and abuses of history
- Investigate how history graduates contribute to numerous work environments
- Interrogate old and new ways of doing history
