Overview

Commentary on the Belfast/Good Friday Agreement (GFA) typically and traditionally focuses on how it impacts on Northern Ireland. However, at the heart of the 1998 Agreement are the principles, institutions and processes which encompass the 'totality of relationships' on the island of Ireland and between Ireland and Britain.

The Agreement, therefore, continues to be consequential for the Republic of Ireland, as much as for Northern Ireland and the rest of the UK – along with the rest of the European Union and the US, as most visibly demonstrated by President Biden.

In its 25th anniversary year, UCC aims to consider what the Good Friday Agreement means for our jurisdiction. This is important in the context of developing a deeper understanding of the past, present, and future for the Agreement across the entire island and not just in Northern Ireland.

The intention is to spark discussion and understanding of the Agreement's key role, in all its dimensions in continuing to underpin peace and prosperity.

In addition to two outstanding keynote speakers sharing their perspectives on this challenge, this anniversary event will bring together a panel of experts for a moderated discussion considering different aspects of the Agreement, and including from a Cork perspective. The panel will address what has been the impact for the city and wider local economy; for allisland cooperation and relations; and for specific sectors and interests across Irish society.
