### Course outline

This course is designed to enhance students' overall English language ability while also developing their academic skills and knowledge as students in an English-speaking university in Ireland. It is designed for university credit transfer based on equivalencies to ECTS.

Each sending institution has a high degree of input into the formation of the programme for their cohort, with the following modules available.

LCSA101 English language development (A2-C2)
LCSA102 Academic English skills development (B1+ to C2 only)
LCSA103 Project work (A2-C2)
LCSA104 Cultural, university and community work (A2-C2)
LCSA105 English language exam preparation (*Elective* A2-C2)

The course is designed using UCC's <u>connected curriculum</u> to create links between disciplines and to foster real-world usage of the English language in contexts relevant to the students' interests and personal aims.



### Course assessment

Assessment is both formative and summative. On registration, students are assessed to establish their language starting points and are placed into an appropriate level learning group.

Students' progress and performance are monitored and individual tutorials are provided at four-weekly intervals throughout the programme. Combined with this continual assessment, a final language test is administered to establish the exit level of students.

Students are required to have a minimum of 85% attendance to pass the course.

Final transcripts are forwarded to the sending institution for validation within two weeks of the completion of the programme.

Should a partner have specific requirements related to attendance or assessment, we will do our best to meet these.



## How we help students study

We know that progress in English for students is a priority and throughout their time with us we will make sure they are in the appropriate level for their English language ability. Together with their teachers we will create a personalized study plan, which we will track during their stay to ensure they are meeting their learning objectives.

Our Language Centre has its own resource room and self-study facilities, and all students have full access to the University Library.

Our highly-qualified teachers come from all over the world and are experienced and skilled in the design and delivery of engaging and effective teaching. We pride ourselves on our teachers' dedication to providing our students with the very best in the classroom and ensuring that their time outside the classroom allows them to make the most of their stay in our University and city.



## Helping students settle in

We place students in suitable accommodation and assist them to adapt and thrive in university life and Irish culture in their time with us.

From the point of application for our courses to the time to return to your home country, we pride ourselves on the personal attention we offer our students.

Prior to arrival we ensure they are placed in the right accommodation; either with one of our carefully-selected host families or in one of our campus-based accommodation centres.
