Critical Care Nursing

The National Foundation Module in Critical Care Nursing is a 10 credit, part-time, taught, blended learning module designed to meet the learning needs of busy Registered Nurses (RNs), by providing a flexible learning environment. The goal of the module is that students will be able to safely and competently care for critically ill patients in the critical care environment in which they are employed. The duration of this module is 26 weeks.

- Unit 6 Care of the Critically III Patient
