MSc (for Clinical Therapists) in Evidence Based Therapy Practice:

Duration: 1 year full time or 2 years part time

CAO Code: CKX15



- One year full time or two years part time taught programme (90 credits)
- Two core modules (30 credits), Two option modules (30 credits) and Research (30 credits)
- Allocated a supervisor with expertise to support your research
- Option to take a specialist module of your choice external to UCC

Students are required to have a primary professional degree in either Occupational Therapy, Speech and Language Therapy or Physiotherapy

Research

- You will work with a supervisor who will support you throughout your research programme leading to a minor thesis.
- Your supervisor will usually be from your own discipline, and will have expertise in either the topic under study or your methodological approach.

- Educating for Professional Practice

Doctor of Occupational Therapy (D.Occ.T)

The D.Occ.T is a three-year full time or six-year parttime professional doctorate programme, consisting of taught modules amounting to 210 credits and a thesis. All students are allocated a supervisor appropriate for their research area or the specific topic of their study.

Entry requirements

A primary professional qualification, a Masters degree and for the D.Occ.T, five years of professional practice experience.

Duration: 3 years full-time or 6 years part-time
