

Suggestions for Places to Eat in Cork City

This is by no means an exhaustive list, just some good restaurants that have come to our attention over the years! Cork is a real food city, and there are many other options as well. Check on the web for opening times.



Western Road on the way from UCC to the city centre:

Paradiso – vegetarian/vegan restaurant serving creative, locally sourced dishes. Relatively expensive, but worth it! Reservations a must.

Liberty Grill – brasserie, casual bistro style.

The Spit Jack – brasserie, casual bistro style.

City Centre – Paul Street area:

Amicus – contemporary bar and grill

Café Mexicana – Mexican

Eastern Tandoori – Indian

Koto – Asian

Restaurant 14a – brasserie/bistro

Strasbourg Goose – traditional cuisine

The Woodford – a bar that serves good pub food.

City Centre – Oliver Plunkett Street area:

Bombay Palace – Indian

Clancy's – pub food

Jacques – French inspired, relatively expensive

Market Lane – traditional cuisine

Nosta – Mediterranean

Oak Fire Pizza – Pizza

The Oliver Plunkett – pub food

Quinlan's – very good seafood restaurant, locally sourced

Thali Nepali Restaurant – Indian/Nepali

Wabisabi Sushi and Noodles – Japanese

Yuan Ming Yuan – Chinese

City Centre – South Mall area:

Quay Co-op – vegetarian (across the south branch of the river on Sullivan's Quay)

Electric – Asian fusion

Jacob's on the Mall – modern European menu

North of the River – MacCurtain Street area:

Sakura – Japanese

Son of a Bun – burgers

Greene's – upscale global cuisine

Isaac's – traditional cuisine, brasserie/bistro style

Da Mirco – Italian

Gallagher's Gastro Pub – pub food

North of the River – North Mall

Franciscan Well Brewery – Pizzas and local beer

English Market (lunches only):

The Sandwich Stall – great sandwiches to take away

Farmgate Café – traditional cuisine, two different menus (less and more expensive)
