

Information for 1st-year students

Delivery of Physics lectures in Semester 1 (updated 10/09/2020)

It is currently planned that your main Physics module, PY1052, will be delivered partly online and partly in person (“blended”). A table indicating when your lectures and tutorials will be held and when you will be able to attend in person is below:

* **CK406, CK407, CK409** – Attend in person in odd-numbered weeks (1, 3, ...)
CK408 – Attend in person in even-numbered weeks (2, 4, ...)

The reason we need to divide you into two groups like this is the regulation that we are to have no more than 50 students in any given lecture. If at some point the restrictions are eased enough that we can have all PY1052 students together at once, we will change the schedule so that all of you can attend all lectures and tutorials in person.

IMPORTANT!

In the first week of the semester only, the first lecture will be given twice, so that all of you will have your first lecture in person. On Monday 28th September,

- **CK408** will have their first PY1052 lecture from 12-1 in Kane B10A.
- **CK406, CK407 and CK409** will have their first PY1052 lecture from 2-3 in Kane G02

Labs: Each student will attend a practical session in Kane room 103 once every two weeks, starting in the 2nd or 3rd week of term, on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday 3-6pm. Each student will be assigned to a specific practical session, depending on the schedule of his or her other modules. Take-home experiments will also be assigned on alternate weeks, to be done by the student at home in their own time.
