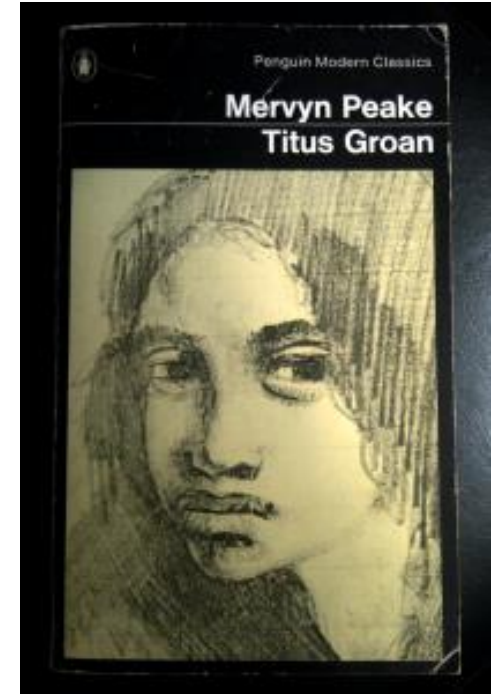


## Words fail me

## And so it is with metaphors.....

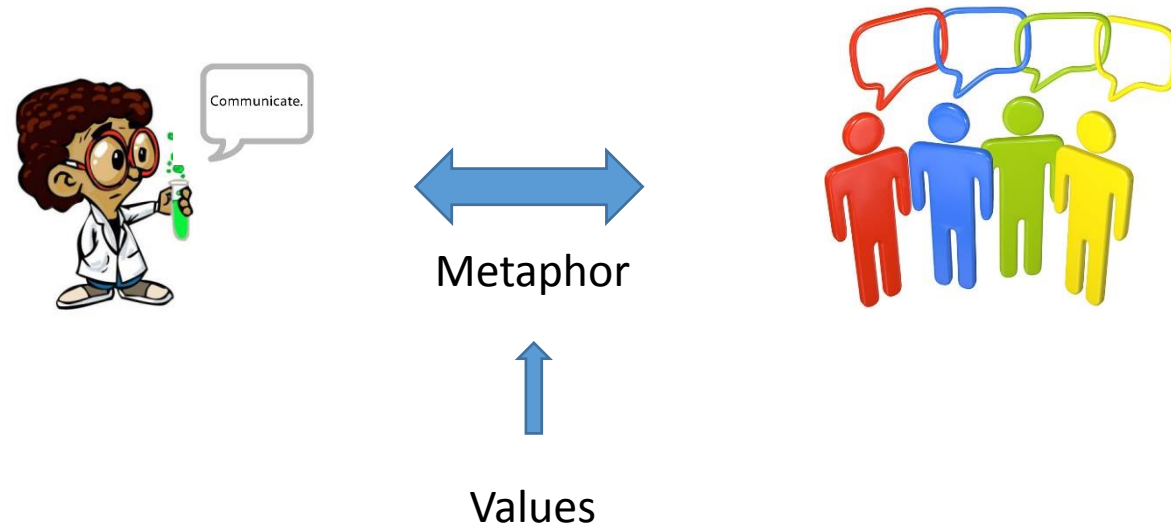
Metaphors allow us to conceptualise something of one sort as if it were another.
