

## MISCELLANY FROM H. 2. 7. (T. C. D.).


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The first half of this MS is a genealogical compilation, written on vellum and of fifteenth century date. It includes extracts from Saltair Caisil in cols. 27, 29, 49, 126, 146, 147. The last extract ends: "Hoc usque de Salterium Caisil scriptus est." This implies that the following matter is from another source. At col. 156<sup>a</sup> begins a collection of notes relating to Munster and Leinster persons and families. The language of these notes contains undoubtedly early forms, such as "Corco Echreg", the eighth century form of Corco Fiachrach. Many of the personal names are of early dates. Broenige and Anblamath are very near to the ogham forms: Broenionias and Anavlamattias. It is noteworthy that the names in the MS refer to persons in Co. Waterford where the corresponding oghams were found. Professor McNeill considers that this miscellany may date from the early part of the eighth century. What internal evidence there is, confirms this view. As far as can be judged the persons and events named are all prior to the year 800. Those who are mentioned in the Annals are:

The family history in par. 7, is not carried further than the grandsons of Fall. Their floruit would be circa 580—620. No other line is carried on later than this.

The bulk of the notes refer to members of the Eoganacht Caisil and Corco Laigde families. The following table shows their relationship and intermarriages. It also suggests that the chronicler was most interested in the Corco Laigde generations of the sixth century. I have supplemented those actually mentioned in the MS with names from other sources in the genealogies. Many place-names mentioned are from Cashel and Waterford. I have not been able to identify them all.



The miscellany contains two lists of the vassal families of the Déisi of Waterford. They are versions of the lists in Laud 610 (*Ériu III*, p. 138) and Rawl. B 502, p. 133 (facs.). I should be inclined to class the list in par. 12 as an older form than the others on account of the early name-forms which it contains.
