Religions and Global Diversity is concerned with the academic, objective study of religions. It does not make any assumptions about your personal beliefs. If you are interested in understanding the diverse ways in which people live their lives, and in learning more about yourself and the world of which you are apart, this subject may be for you. On completion of their BA degree Religions and Global Diversity and for other graduates who achieved highly in their primary degree in cognate areas seeking to study religions at postgraduate level, the department offers a Masters programme (MA Contemporary Religions).

WHAT CAN RELIGIONS AND GLOBAL DIVERSITY GRADUATES OFFER EMPLOYERS?

Study of Religions graduates are reflexive, cultural diversity sensitive, conscientious, hard-working and highly self-responsible graduates with a range of transversal/soft skills. The transversal skills are crucial in a wide variety of situations and work settings and are increasingly in high demand for learners to successfully adapt to social, cultural, environmental and global climate changes to lead meaningful and productive lives. Skills such as:

- Critical and innovative thinking.
- Inter-personal skills (e.g. presentation and communication skills, organizational skills, teamwork, etc.)
- Intra-personal skills (e.g. self-discipline, enthusiasm, perseverance, self-motivation, etc.)



- Global citizenship (e.g. tolerance, openness, respect for diversity, intercultural understanding, etc.)

- Religious literacy such as the ability know the basic aspects and differences of world and minority religions.

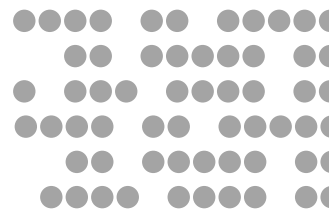
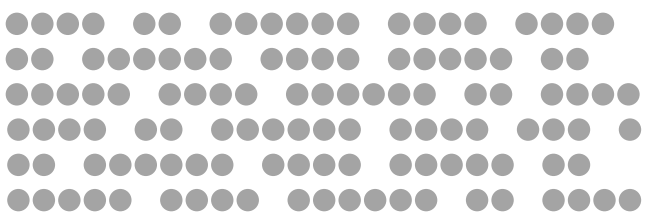
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GRADUATE OUTCOMES FOR RELIGIONS AND GLOBAL DIVERSITY STUDENTS

GRADUATE STUDIES

Year 1: You will study a module on Religions in the Contemporary World which looks at the various ways in which religions can be studied and provides overviews of religions East and West and their role in contemporary societies.

Years 2/3: You will study a range of religious traditions and approaches in more depth, including: Authority & Community in Contemporary Christianities, Christianities in a Global Age, Hinduism and Indian Religions, Indigenous Religions, Islam: Historical & Contemporary Perspectives, Religions and Gender, Religions in Contemporary Ireland, New Religious Movements and Western Esotericism, Religions of East Asia, Buddhism in Practice, Dissertation in the Study of Religions.

After finishing my Masters in Religions and Diversity,

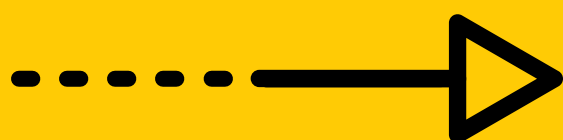
