
## This training supports Foster Carers to enhance and develop their skills:

- to communicate better with their child
- 2) to improve their child's behaviour
- 5) to reduce their own stress levels, and
- 4) to increase their satisfaction in Fostering.

"Foster carers cannot work with children in the dark, it's like working in isolation, you can't do it. You have to have some basic understanding what has gone on for the child, what has brought him into care and that information giving is very slow and it is something that should be recognised."

The Fostering Connections Programme is built on 6 core principles of Trauma informed Foster Care which are covered over six 3.5 hour sessions. The course is run weekly or monthly depending on demand.
