What has UCCRSA achieved for you?

Researcher advocacy

In recent years the UCCRSA committee has met with the President of UCC, the Vice-President for Research and Innovation, and senior HR staff to discuss and resolve matters related to researchers in UCC. Achievements arising from these meetings include:

- The UCC Researcher annual conference
- Researchers being formally named on grant applications
- Teaching contributions being recorded centrally in UCC Book of Modules

Our current areas of concern include:

- Designation of post-docs as 'trainees'
- Support for a diversity of career paths
- The impact of Brexit on Irish Researchers
- Opportunities for senior research staff to acquire external funding

Development of national and international networks

UCCRSA liaises with other national and international Research Staff Associations, including the International Consortium of Research Staff Associations (ICORSA: www.icorsa.org)

We have also developed closer links with IFUT, and are raising Researcher Issues at the National level in respect of Researcher Policy and Terms and Conditions of Employment, including Contracts.

Committee representation

UCCRSA successfully petitioned for increased researcher representation at all levels of UCC administration to ensure your issues are addressed. UCCRSA members currently sit on UCC's Governing Authority; Academic Council; Staff Development and Enhancement; and Athena SWAN committees, among many others.

Holiday entitlements

In 2010, UCCRSA successfully petitioned to increase holiday entitlements in line with Academic staff, by getting 5 privilege days over the Christmas period.

Industry seminars

Estimates suggest that up to 80% of current research staff will eventually move away from academia. To help with this transition, UCCRSA works with UCC Careers Office and HR to develop a range of industry careers seminars, foster industry connections, and set up meetings with company representatives.

Meet and greet events

Our coffee mornings and lunches provide an opportunity to meet your fellow researchers and the UCCRSA committee, and to communicate any issues or concerns to us so we can advise and help.
