National Foundation Education Module Critical Care Nursing

The National Foundation Module in Critical Care Nursing is a 10 credit, part-time, taught, blended learning module designed to meet the learning needs of busy Registered Nurses (RNs), by providing a flexible (blended) learning environment. The duration of this module is 26 weeks. There are two intakes per year: September and February.
