Transition Out initiatives are preparing final year students to transition into professional environments, delivering on the ambitions of UCC's Institutional Employability and Employment Guide.



TRANSITION THROUGH

- A collection of university-wide Graduate Attribute academic case studies have been gathered and collated across multiple disciplines. These informational videos, case studies and student showcase projects are available on the website.
- "Everyday Matters: Healthy Habits for University Life" digital badge, developed by Dr. Eithne Hunt (School of Clinical Therapies), was successfully delivered on a pilot basis to first year CACSSS students in Semester 1 2019/2020.



TRANSITION OUT

- A collaborative project between UCC Career Services and key staff within the College of Arts, Celtic Studies and Social Sciences developed a complete set of thirty discipline specific employability and employment guides.
- A series of eight workshops has been developed by Career Services on thematic areas relating to employability skills in collaboration with the Graduate Attributes Programme.

EngagingInternational Languages

A collaborative project with the **School of Languages, Literatures and Cultures** here in UCC as well as other staff throughout the university is enabling us to create language specific videos of all the attributes and values in various languages spoken across the entire university.

Students across all disciplines continue to champion the Graduate Attributes Programme locally and globally, showcasing their attributes and values in a myriad of ways.

In February we will be launching our next video, which is "As Gaeilge", and further videos in Spanish, Portuguese, Italian, French, German, Hindi.....We will even be producing a version with Sign Language!



PHARMACY

Staff at the School of Pharmacy have presented extensive work, mapping the MPharm curriculum to the Core Competency Framework and to the UCC Graduate Attributes – two students undertook this project as part of their 4 month placement with Dr JJ Keating.

The information displayed constitutes the six domains and some of their associated behaviours of the Pharmaceutical Society of Ireland (PSI) Core Competency Framework for Pharmacists (CCF).



RESILIENCE

The CCF informs educational standards for pharmacy programmes in Ireland, provides a platform for the development of specialisation and advanced practice within pharmacy, and also provides a public statement of the professional role of a pharmacist.

These posters demonstrate how the UCC MPharm degree provides students with a myriad of pathways and opportunities to achieve competence in UCC's Graduate Attributes, while directly relevant to professional practice.

Looking ahead to 2020....!

At annual registration, students will submit a self assessment to determine the extent to which they have developed these values and attributes through their educational and life experiences. A digital application will generate a spikey profile, or computer generated graph, that illustrates students' starting point within each attribute and value.


1. Self-awareness of planning

This project will offer every student a personalised, professional development journey while in UCC, which will include graduate attributes and core values with signposting to recommended resources and services. This self-assessment tool will be optimised for attributes and values development, bringing formal and informal learning together through competence frameworks, self-assessment and digital badges as students progress



Students will be pointed in the direction of further ways to develop their core values and attributes, as relevant to their performance in the self assessment.

Transition to Arts Campaign

During 2020, we will be engaged in quite a substantial 'Transitions to Arts' campaign, along with staff from the College of Arts, Celtic Studies and Social Sciences, with the support of the Office of Marketing and Communications. Early in Semester 2 we will be bringing you our first video as part of this campaign!
