

- Encourage PSLs to draw upon their personal university journeys to guide students assigned to them
- Students communicate their unique personal lived experiences and knowledge



▶ DIGITALLY FLUENT

- Much of a PSL's ongoing interaction with students takes place in a digital space
- PSLs receive training on online tone and conduct from the UCC Skills Centre



► INDEPENDENT AND CREATIVE THINKERS

- Structured to promote teamwork and collaboration with an expectation that PSLs display independence and initiative in their role
- Wide variety of events and initiatives that are led by the PSLs:
 - PITstop (Peer Information Table)
 - social integration events for 1st Year and International students
- recruitment drives
- interviews
- focus groups

- Reflect the connection UCC has with its students but also the individuality and independent voice that the students are encouraged to have at the station
- Framework which helps students to think in an interdisciplinary fashion and to develop critical thinking in the context of their formal education

- Over 50 regular volunteers actively taking part in programme production each week

STUDENT SOCIETIES



SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

- Dozens of societies with a socially responsible ethos and agenda (particularly in our social, political and activism, charitable and religious societies groupings)
- Our society committee members are some of the most socially responsible and engaged students on campus
- Many societies have a focus on outreach - visiting schools and youth clubs in Cork and nationally to share skills and insights
- Huge focus on community engagement and one of the five pillars in our current strategic plan is based solely on community engagement
- The Student Community Support (SCS) provides pastoral care to the students in attendance at balls and helps to reduce anti-social behaviour
- Work with the SU to devise, develop and deliver a harm reduction campaign



▶ CREATORS, EVALUATORS **AND COMMUNICATORS OF KNOWLEDGE**

- 109 societies cater for over 12.600 students across 7 fields: social, political & activism, creative, SEFS. Business and Law/Medicine and Health, cultural & debating and charitable & religious
- Provide an infrastructure and platform for the students to reach out, inform. interact, assess, conceive and discover
- 2500+ events per year created, curated and communicated by student committees
- Provide 11 different 'train the trainer' sessions in key areas of committee administrations. Hundreds of guest speakers hosted every year to communicate their insights and discoveries
- One of the five pillars in our current strategic plan focuses on 'communication and collaboration'



▶ EFFECTIVE, GLOBAL **CITIZENS WHO RECOGNISE AND** CHALLENGE INEQUALITY

- Provide a platform and support to celebrate diversity in all its forms and to challenge the inequalities of our age
- Remarkable engagement in campaigns, conferences and protests whose key aims are to improve conditions for all in our little campus community and on a wider national and international scale
- Facilitate the joining together of our students in a shared cause to observe and challenge viewpoints
- Our societies events are seen as a 'safe space' for people of all backgrounds, sexual orientation, race and religion
- Zero tolerance 'bullying and harassment' policy and work closely with Campus Watch



▶ DIGITALLY FLUENT

- Provide training to increase digital fluency: Website Training, Portal Training, Graphic Design Training and Social Media training
- All committee resources are based on online portal
- Premium graphic design tools available (a suite of Apple Mac Computers equipped with Adobe photoshop and Canva premium)
- · Each society is given ownership of their own individual website
- First Societies department in Ireland to require domestic awards applications to be digitised









▶ INDEPENDENT AND CREATIVE THINKERS

- Provide training and guidance to enable the societies to be at the helm of their own creation
- Facilitate empowerment and not micromanagement of UCC societies

▶ DIGITALLY FLUENT

- Events and activities are publicised through WhatsApp, Facebook, Instagram, Google Forms, Mail Chimp and Canvas
- Moving towards digital-only to encourage fluency on such events as Relay for Life sign ups
- Faith resources on apps and websites



► CREATORS, EVALUATORS AND COMMUNICATORS OF KNOWLEDGE

- In 1:1 meetings students can create new goals, evaluate current ones and/ or communicate knowledge attained
- Lounge provides opportunity for formal/informal discussions and group study
- Student interns can gain event planning and team work skills



► INDEPENDENT AND CREATIVE THINKERS

- Discussion with others through a lens of faith offers independent and creative solutions
- A culture of 'wrestling with faith questions' fosters an analytical and unbiased mindset
- Different expressions of faith and forms of prayer allow students to cultivate and encounter different forms of self-expression and culture



► EFFECTIVE, GLOBAL CITIZENS WHO RECOGNISE AND CHALLENGE INEQUALITY

- Faith series on 'finding a voice'
- Thursday Socials are an opportunity for students from various countries to spend casual time together
- Publicly support initiatives that challenge inequality such as Refugee Week, Bystander Intervention Week, LGBT Society, Disability Support Services, etc.
- Annual international trip to a holy site allows inter-cultural skills and awareness to be developed



SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

- Facilitate discussions with members of the community (Cork Penny Dinners, the Staff LGBT Network, and a former professional footballerturned priest) to offer students awareness of issues in the modern world and an idea of conversations to have or life paths to choose to help cultivate change, understanding and healing
- Events such as Relay for Life team, Christmas food collection, Charity Coffee Morning fundraising
- Taking steps to reduce plastic and use crockery and silverware in kitchen
- Offer alternative activities on walking retreats to accommodate students with disabilities and medical requirements

- Act as a vehicle for students to bring forward their evaluations and thoughts on teaching and learning policy

- Raise awareness of student issues through social media platforms
- Represent student interests on the IT Steering Committee and the E-Learning Committee

- Important role in challenging inequality at local and societal level
- Equality working group consists of 7 different officers who promote different strands of equality across campus

- Online survey of risk factors, a risk register and training needs analysis completed by clubs and societies
- Strong emphasis on student activity safety management system being data-driven

- Elements of safety training and event planning reference obligations under Employment Equality Act
- Communicate importance of making sure events are inclusive and not discriminatory
- Hazing included in training as a nonacceptable activity

 Encourage students to be co-creators and contribute to training on risk assessment and hazard reporting



CREATORS, EVALUATORS AND COMMUNICATORS OF KNOWLEDGE

- Deliver training on how to create risk assessments and safety statements
- Deliver training on how to evaluate risks and communicate relevant event safety information to all members of clubs and societies



SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

- Accident and Hazard (safety concern) reporting tool available to students
- Do risk assessments and deliver training to ensure the safety of students and other stakeholders
- Deliver Emergency First Aid sessions and train up multiple First Aiders
- Hands-only CPR day held in collaboration with UCC ASSERT and Irish Heart
- Establishment of UCC Student Activity Safety Committee

STUDENT COUNSELLING & DEVELOPMENT



CREATORS, EVALUATORS AND COMMUNICATORS OF KNOWLEDGE

- Throughout the therapeutic process, students create new goals, evaluate current ones and communicate skills and knowledge attained
- Deliver workshops on a wide range of topics including: anxiety management, psychological approaches to sleep, identifying and responding to students in distress, etc.



SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE

- Promote responsibility for one's own life, health, wellbeing, safety and self-care
- Raise awareness of the need to be cognisant of the impact of one's behaviour on other people
- Imbue a sense of social and moral responsibility
- Highlight the need to take ownership and responsibility for one's actions
- Teach skills of perspective taking, feeling and demonstrating empathy
- Teach skill of assertive communication
- Highlight the necessity of respect for oneself and others
- Challenge anti-social behaviour and promote altruistic compassionate behaviour

- Instil confidence to express opinions and develop an openness and capacity to identify new ways of viewing and thinking about life and the world
- Foster a mindset of thinking outside the box
- Facilitate reflective and critical capacity
