Those of you who enter Ireland with a **non-European Union passport** will be required to register with the Immigration office in Dublin city in order to obtain your Irish Residence Permit (IRP)Card.

Arriving to Ireland

When arriving at the Airport in Ireland, please have the following on your person:

- Your passport
- Study visa to enter Ireland (**if applicable- more details here**)
- Your UCC Letter of acceptance (PRINTED)

You may also be asked to show any of the following documents:


- Proof of **private medical insurance** (original policy document with your name on it, covering the full length of stay including relevant dates. Must include full hospital cover)
- Evidence of **Cork address**

Irish Residence Permit (IRP)Card

Immigration Steps

1. Your passport will be stamped when you arrive into Ireland (Airport)
2. You will need to book an appointment online (after arriving to Ireland)
3. Attend UCC's orientation where we will provide an immigration registration information session
4. Attend your appointment in Dublin city
5. Bring all required documents
6. Your IRP card will be mailed to your cork address
7. During peak times, an appointment may not be available for a number of weeks
