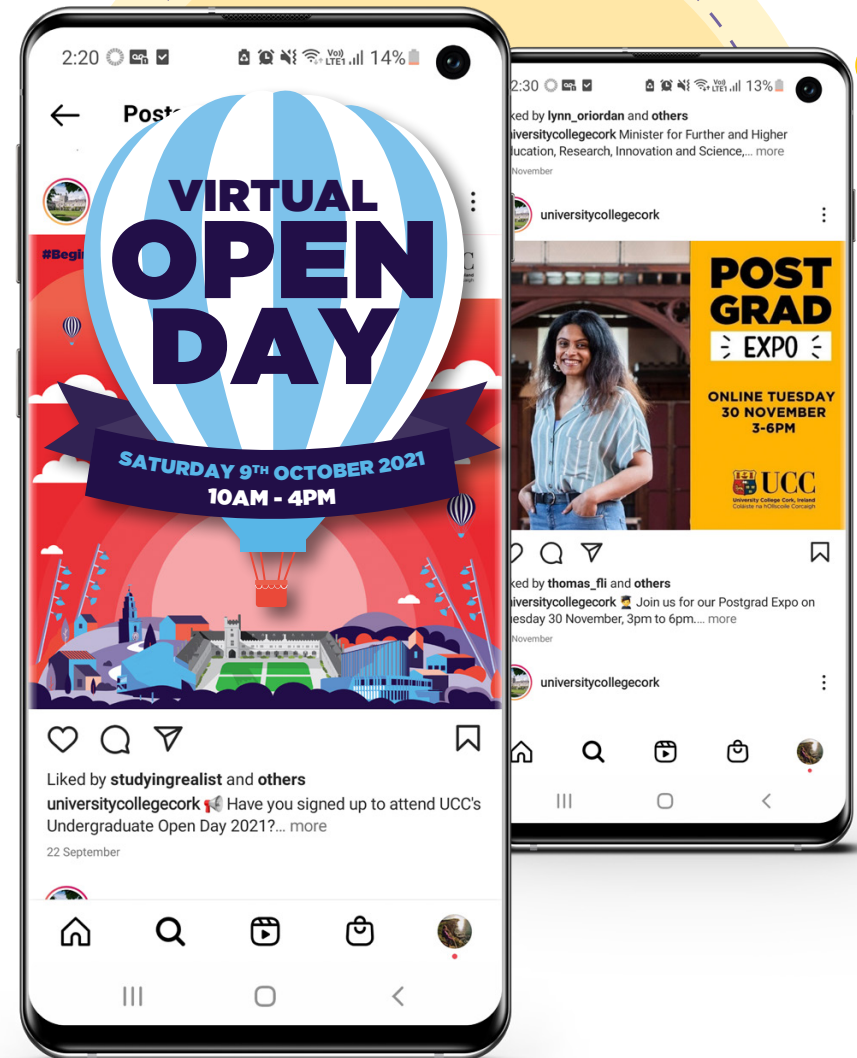

New Programmes

International Business with Languages (CK215)

Cork University Business School, in partnership with the UCC School of Languages, Literatures and Cultures, is proud to offer a new degree programme for 2022 entry. The new BSc International Business with Languages is designed to maintain and reinforce the strengths offered by the previous Commerce International programmes, whilst reinvigorating the offering with a focus on international business and inter-disciplinarity.

CK215

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Minimum grade H3 in a language other than English and minimum grade H5 in one other subject. Minimum grade O6/H7 in four other subjects.

Subjects must include Irish, English, Mathematics, another language, and two other subjects recognised for entry purposes.

ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATIONS

- To study French requires a H3 in French
- To study Irish requires a H2 in Irish
- To study a language at non-beginners' level, a minimum grade H4 in that Language in the Leaving Certificate is required.
- All languages (except French and Irish) have a beginner's stream if you do not meet the specific grade for the language you wish to study.
- A fundamental aspect of the BSc International Business with Languages degree programme is the study year abroad in Year 3.



Changes To Existing Programmes

- ✓ BA Geographical and Archaeological Sciences (CK107) has had its final intake of first years in 21/22 and will not be offered from academic year 2022 onwards.
- ✓ The BComm International with Languages programmes, as listed in the CAO Handbook (CK205 – CK211), are no longer being offered and will not be available for 2022 entry. These programmes have effectively been collapsed into the new BSc International Business (CK215).
- ✓ The degree outlets BSc (Hons) Earth Science, BSc (Hons) Geography, BSc (Hons) Geology and BSc (Hons) International Field Geosciences, which students choose at the end of year one, have been removed as degree outlets from CK404. **These will be replaced by a new degree outlet BSc (Hons) Geosciences for students entering second year from 2023/2024.**

Olympian and World Champion Puspure appointed UCC Head Rowing Coach

UCC is delighted to confirm the appointment of two-time World Champion and three-time Olympian Sanita Puspure as UCC Sport's new head coach for rowing. Ms Puspure - a World Champion in the single skulls in 2018 and 2019 - is a Level 3 qualified rowing coach and recently completed a Degree in Sport Science and Conditioning with Setanta College. The appointment has been made possible thanks to the support of Bank of Ireland. UCC Rowing Club has in the region of 220 registered members for 2021/22 across novice, intermediate, club and senior crews - both male and female. It has won National Championship events and boasts several Olympians as current members including gold medal winner Paul O'Donovan, Bronze medal winner Emily Hegarty, and rowers who were part of Team Ireland in the Tokyo games such as Ronan Byrne, Aoife Casey, Margaret Cremen, Lydia Heaphy and Tara Hanlon. The club also has several international rowers such as club captain Hugh Sutton, John Kearney, Alex Byrne, and Will Ronayne who have competed at Junior, U23, and Senior Level for Ireland. Martin Kilbane and David Breen will work closely with Sanita to develop the new crop of rowers who are just starting out on their journey wearing the "Skull & Bones" and who aspire to be Ireland's next Olympians. 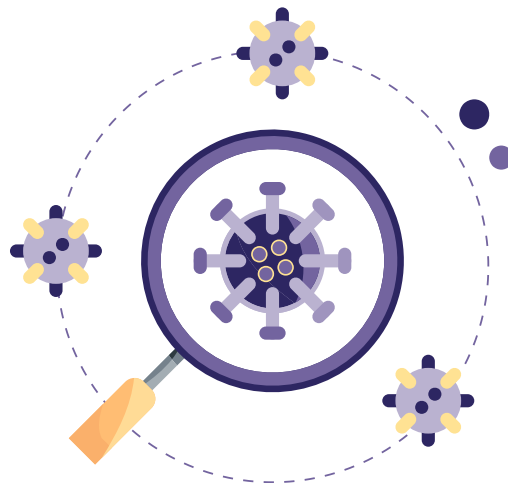


WE ARE... SOCIALY RESPONSIBLE

UniCov – Safeguarding our campus

To facilitate the safe, continual return to on-campus learning and teaching for UCC students and staff, UCC has been participating in the **UniCoV initiative** since September. UniCoV is a multi-site, randomised controlled clinical study led by the National University of Ireland Galway (NUIG) in partnership with Trinity College Dublin (TCD), University College Dublin (UCD) and UCC. Since September, we have had over 1,500 sign-ups and completed in excess of 13,500 rapid tests, more than any of the other participating HEIs!

Inclusive UCC

As part of the National Forum VIT&L (Valuing Ireland's Teaching and Learning) Week, a number of key **events were run at UCC** including the launch of **Inclusive UCC**. The purpose of this project is to help UCC in its broader aim to be a leader in digital inclusion. What we're trying to do is build on the great pockets of inclusive practice that are happening at our university to make it more systematically institution-wide. Drawing on the core principle of Universal Design for Learning, this project will play to all learners' strengths, it will level the playing field for our diverse student body and will make learning accessible for all of our students. Supports and guidance have been developed to **empower our students**, including an **Accessibility Skills Guide**. There is also a section to **empower and equip our staff**, including open access **workshops and webinars**. More information on this initiative can be accessed [here](#).

Digital Badge for Autism Awareness

As part of VIT&L week, this digital badge was launched and it has been designed to encourage staff understand of what it is like to be an autistic university student and suggest ways for participants to make either their own role or their service or department more 'autism-friendly'. The first of its kind in the country, it was designed in a collaborative way with input from staff and autistic students and is one of the elements of our **Autism-Friendly University Initiative**.

Bystander Intervention

On Friday 3 of September, UCC's Bystander Intervention Programme launched its national campaign as training initiatives for staff and students across Irish Higher Education Universities. UCC's Bystander intervention aims to raise awareness of not only the importance of safe and effective interventions, but also encourage staff and students to become active bystanders and develop the skills and awareness to address sexual violence harassments across third level institutions.

Alongside the launch of the campaign, UCC Bystander released a **15 minute starter video** that includes key concepts on how to become an active bystander. Bystander has also launched a pilot programme with a modified version of the Bystander Intervention programme for second level, with its first launch at the Cork Life Centre which is a voluntary organisation that offers an alternative learning environment to young people that find themselves outside the mainstream education system.

Award-winning author and columnist Louise O'Neill received an Honorary Doctorate in Law

On Friday 19 November, award-winning author and columnist Louise O'Neill received an Honorary Doctorate in Law in recognition of her work's role in bringing problematic issues to the fore in contemporary discourse. A native of Clonakilty, Ms O'Neill released her first Young Adult (YA) novel *Only Ever Yours* in 2014, which subsequently received accolades including Sunday Independent Newcomer of the Year at the 2014 Bord Gáis Energy Irish Book Awards; the Children's Books Ireland Eilís Dillon Award for a First Children's Book; and The Bookseller's inaugural YA Book Prize 2015. Ms O'Neill was nominated for the honour by Prof. Louise Crowley of the School of Law, and leader of UCC's Bystander Intervention Programme. She said: "Louise O'Neill is the voice of her generation. Through her writing and play adaptations, Louise's work has made a significant and challenging contribution to the contemporary narrative surrounding key societal issues." Read more [here](#).

Free Year Planner

In collaboration with colleagues in First Year Experience, International Office, Peer Support, Career Services, Access and the Skills Centre, UCC's Graduate Attributes Programme has developed a **Year Planner booklet**. 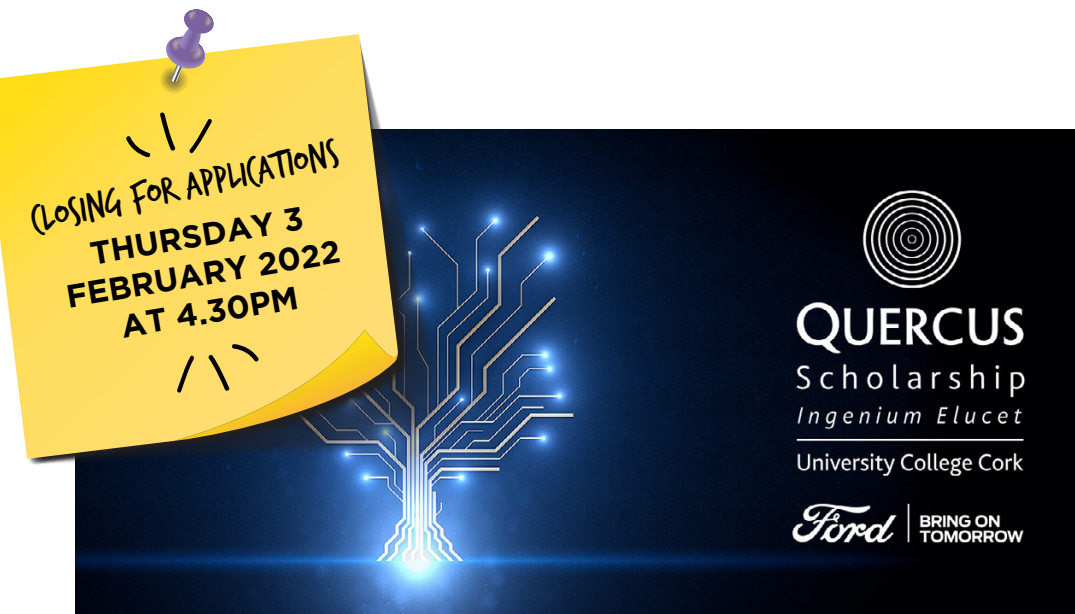

UCC at COP26

As international leaders in sustainability, UCC was the only Irish university with official observer status at the recent **UN COP26 global climate change summit** and sent a delegation of nine researchers and students to Glasgow to engage, participate and contribute to the conversation with delegates from 197 states. 120 world leaders and as many as 30,000 delegates over the two weeks are estimated to have been in attendance. The UCC delegation consisted of experts in carbon emissions and budgets, transport, societal change, sustainable cities, air and water pollution and energy efficiency. To coincide with the COP26, UCC commissioned a **special sustainability mural** at one of the main entrances to campus, to raise awareness of the global climate crisis and the need to think and act in a sustainable and responsible way.



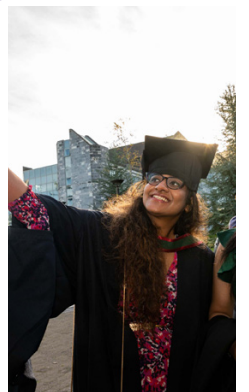
The Green Campus Podcast

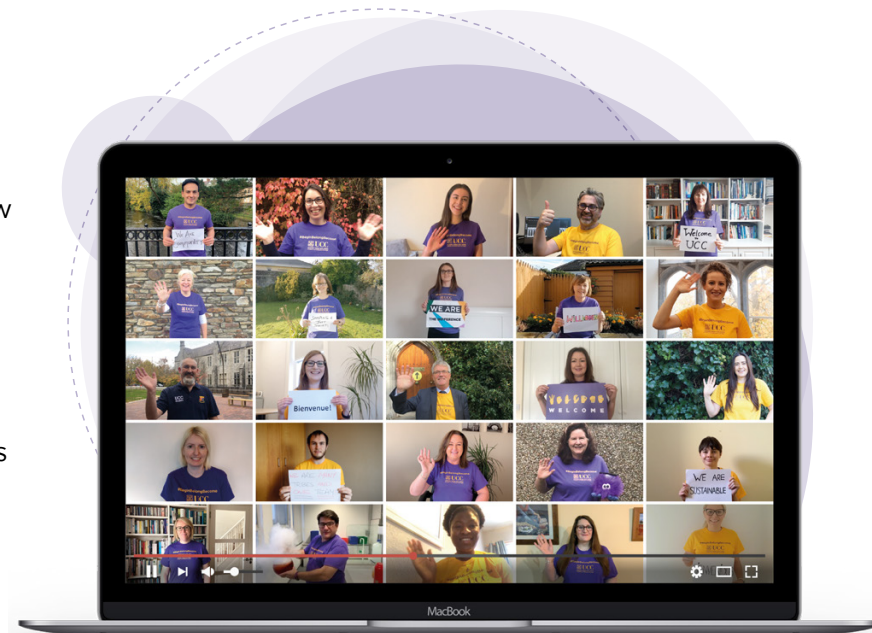




WE ARE... COMMUNITY

UCC President John O' Halloran unveiled the UCC Rainbow Walkway on campus to mark National Coming Out Day on October 11 and as part of UCC Community Week. The UCC Rainbow Walkway was installed to celebrate and recognise the diversity of the UCC community and to express UCC's firm commitment to the creation of a campus that is inclusive, where the whole of the UCC community can feel a sense of welcome and belonging. Minister for Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, Simon Harris TD visited UCC on the 10 November and got a tour of the much cherished Old College Bar which has been transformed into a dedicated space of respite and calm for students, and in particular students on the autism spectrum. The Minister also saw how UCC has transformed its campus to meet the diverse needs of its students, with a recently developed calm outdoor spaces including the Boole Courtyard and the Hawthorn Garden. The Minister also met UCC staff on the **#ProgresswithPride** Rainbow Walkway. UCC was the first LGBT+ Staff Network & Student Society in an Irish university.
