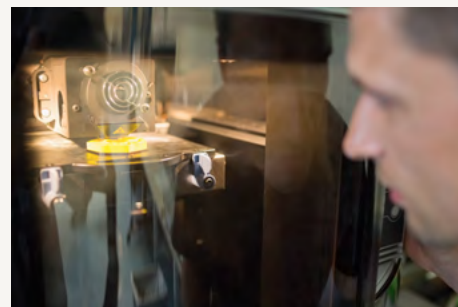

CK600 BE (Hons) Engineering or Master of Engineering (Integrated ME)

CK600 Engineering is the entry point to all of the Engineering programmes at UCC. After completing a common first year, students choose their second year pathway from one of the following:

- Civil, Structural & Environmental Engineering
- Electrical & Electronic Engineering
- Energy Engineering
- Process & Chemical Engineering

Each of the pathways in second year provides students with the option of completing the four year BE course or the five year ME course. To meet the educational requirements for Professional Chartered Engineer a Masters (ME) degree is needed. At the end of third year, students can choose to carry on the BE with one further year of study or to transfer to the ME with two further years of study, subject to achieving an average mark of 50%. Fourth year ME students develop their core knowledge to an advanced level in the first semester before undertaking an eight-month industrial placement to develop further their skills in an industrial environment. The major component of the final year is an individual research project carried out over the year.

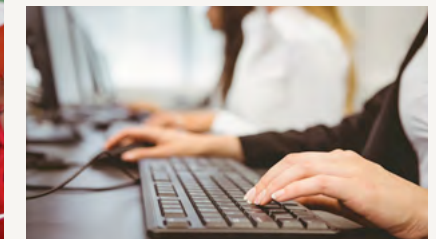

CK201 BComm

The BComm (Hons) programme has been redesigned and a number of changes made to the programmes modules are as follows:

- Realignment of the content of the BComm, moving from disciplinary majors to five thematic major areas in line with employment requirements as follows:
 - Banking and Financial Markets
 - Human Resources and Leadership
 - Innovation, Entrepreneurship and Strategy
 - Markets and Consumer Understanding
 - Operations and Supply Chains

The UCC Department of Sport and Physical Activity has a long established Sports Scholarship Scheme in place. Scholarships have been remodelled in line with the new Strategy for Sport.

The UCC Sport Scholarship programme is divided into two main strands:

- (1) UCC Individual Sport Scholarship – which is divided into three levels: Gold, Silver and Bronze. The Individual Sport Scholarship is open to applicants involved in team sports or individual sports other than the core sports. Scholarships can be worth up to €2,000.
- (2) UCC Core Team Sport Scholarships which covers Hockey, Rugby, Soccer and GAA which

incorporates Gaelic Football, Hurling, Ladies Gaelic Football and Camogie. Specific benefits include a funding bursary, access to support services – high performance programme, coaching, physiology, sports science and medical support.

The Roy Keane UCC Sport Soccer Scholarship and the M.J. Dowling UCC Sport Hurling Scholarships are also open for application and are valued at €20,000 each over a four-year period.
