

- The programme combines aspects of teaching and learning in higher education and of English language development. It is organised by the UCC Centre for the Integration of Research, Teaching and Learning (CIRTL), the UCC Language Centre and the UCC International Office.
- Participants have the option to choose a three or six month programme during the University's semesterised year.
- A concentrated version of the programme is also available as a Summer School option.
- Shorter bespoke programmes can be designed on request.

Teaching and Learning in Higher Education





Programme



The objective of this part of the programme is to provide visiting lecturers/participants with an overview of the key theories of teaching, learning and assessment in higher education. Various models of curriculum design and development are explored and a range of modes and techniques of assessment are introduced. Scholars will focus on ways of facilitating student learning by researching their own teaching.

The programme is grounded in the work of two major drivers of contemporary theory and practice in teaching and learning in higher education in the USA: The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching, and the Project Zero Classroom at the Harvard Graduate School of Education. Such influences, coupled with local commitment to teaching and learning at UCC, make the programme the longest running and most successful in the country.

The themes of the programme include:

- · Teaching places, Learning spaces.
- Learning how to learn: Implications for how we teach.
- Different folks, different strokes; multiple intelligences theory – what every teacher should know.
- Assessment: Assidere sitting beside the student.
- Reflection: The case for the scholar as reflective practitioner.



English Language Development Programme _____



The language programme will comprise of:

- Placement test (to assess grammar, vocabulary, writing and speaking level)
- A needs analysis, to ascertain individual's specific needs/ preferences in relation to language learning.
- The lecturers/participants will receive eight hours per week of English language tuition, comprising of four hours bespoke programme and four hours integrated with students of other nationalities and of their own level
- All classes place an emphasis on developing the learner's ability to communicate confidently and competently.



Achievements

On completion of this language course scholars will receive:

- A certificate acknowledging professional development in English language proficiency.
- A report on their progress in relation to language skills and systems.

On completion of the Teaching and Learning course, scholars will receive:

- A certificate acknowledging professional development in integrating research, teaching and learning.
- Access to links and archives that will sustain their research work in this field.
- The course also provides a pathway to the online ECTS certified programme in Teaching and Learning in Higher Education



Cultural Experiences and Outings

A social and cultural programme accompanies these courses.
Participants can avail of excursions to include local and national settings, such as, local historical sites, museums, castles, and harbour towns, including lectures on an introduction to Irish Language and Irish Traditional Music
