EU Undergraduate Students

You may pay fees all at once or in 2 instalments as per dates below.

The Student Contribution Charge for 2020/21 is **€3000.**

The Capitation Fee for 2020/21 is **€170**

Student Type	What is Due?	Deadline for Payment
Undergraduate students eligible for free tuition fees.	Student Contribution and Capitation Fee.	First Instalment (€1670) during registration process' Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.
Undergraduate students eligible for HALF tuition fees.	Half programme fee plus Student Contribution and Capitation Fee.	First instalment (€1670) plus half tuition fees during registration process. Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.

Starting in September 2020

Undergraduate students not on 'free' fees programme (EU).	Full EU programme fee plus Student Contribution and Capitation Fee.	First Instalment (€1670) plus 50% of your course tuition fees during registration process' Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.
Repeating a full Academic year.	Student Contribution, Capitation Fee and full programme fee.	First Instalment (€1670 plus half programme fee) Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.
Repeating less than full programme credits.	Half programme repeat fee plus Student Contribution (as per amount of credits to be repeated) and Capitation Fee.	First instalment (€170 plus half tuition fees plus half Student Contribution) during registration process. Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.
Incoming Undergraduates awaiting approval of a SUSI grant application **	Student Capitation Fee.	€170 to be paid during registration process.

**** If you are not successful in your SUSI application, you will be liable for Student Contribution and in some cases Tuition fees.**

Non-EU Undergraduate Students

Student Type	What is Due?	Deadline for Payment
1 st Year Non-EU Undergraduates	Full Non-EU programme Fee	First instalment of half tuition fees prior to registration Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.
Ongoing Non-EU undergraduates	Full Non-EU programme Fee	First instalment half tuition fees during registration process Remaining balance on or before 31/01/21.

What happens if I don't pay my fees on time?

Undergraduates – Continuing Students

If you owe fees at the end of an academic year, it will affect the following:

- Late payment charges will be applied to your account
- Access to registration for the next academic year
- Conferring
- Admission to a new programme
- **Final year students** will not be allowed to graduate until all fees and charges, including fines, have been paid

Postgraduates:

- Continuing students will not be progressed to the following year of their programme
- Final year students will not be permitted to graduate until full fees and, where applicable, fines have been paid.

All student fees are required to be paid by the published dates.

If you do not meet the payment dates, you may incur late payment penalties as detailed in the [Student Debtor Policy](#) of the University. The conditions of the Debtor Policy are brought to your notice before you register to the university and are binding once registration is confirmed. All students agree to the terms and conditions of the University when they register to their programme.

For ongoing students, if fees have not been paid by Registration, students will be denied access to Canvas and the services attached to their ID card may be de-activated e.g. access to Mardyke Arena and the Library.

How can I get a block removed from my account?

To get a hold removed from your account you must pay;

- All your outstanding debt

Recommendations and advice

- Students must familiarise themselves with the University's regulations, which cover student fees, payment dates and registration procedures.
- Check your fee account on the student portal regularly.
- Make payments when they are due.
- Clear your outstanding balance by the end of the January to avoid future implications.
- Check your Umail messages as Fees Office only email students through the Umail process.

If you are experiencing financial challenges contact your **Student Adviser** who can provide information on supports. It's not possible for any funding received from the Student Assistance or Student Welfare funds to be used for the payment for fees.
