<b>Note 1:</b> All First year International Students must pay their fees in 1 instalment prior to registration			
<b>Note 2:</b> An additional Instrument Bench Fee of €1500 applies to all third year students with the remaining balance to be paid at the start of fourth year in the amount of €1500 with the balance of €1000 to be paid at the start of fifth year. Full details are in the College Calendar			
<b>Note 3:</b> An additional Instrument Bench Fee of €1300 applies to all second year students for Graduate Entry Dentistry with the remaining balance to be paid at the start of the following year in the amount of €1500 with the balance of €1000 to be paid at the start of final year. Full details are in the College Calendar			
<b>Note 4:</b> Students entering through recruitment agencies, the IUMC (Irish Universities & Medical Schools Consortium) or through government sponsorship may be entitled to a concession on the quoted international fee.			
<b>Note 5:</b> International students entering through recognised recruitment streams may be entitled to some concessions			
<b>Note 6:</b> Please note that the School of Medicine proposes to introduce a €750 Clinical Placement Contribution from Sept 2020 onwards. Students entering undergraduate medicine degree programmes CK70 and CK791 will be required to make an annual payment of a Clinical Placement Contribution in specific years where the clinical site element of the course is deemed significant i.e. Years 3,4 and 5 for CK70 students and years 2,3 and 4 for CK791 students. The payment will be incorporated into the fee structure for international/non EU fee for CK70 and CK791.			
<b>Note 7:</b> From 2015 entry, Pharmacy is a five year integrated degree programme. Students will graduate with a level 9 BPharm degree having completed a BPharm (first four years) and will then progress to a fifth year (MPharm). The cost of the final fifth year of the programme is not covered under the State's Free Tuition Fees Scheme. EU Tuition fees are set for the final fifth year of the programme, the cost is €7,500 (International fee €20,000).			
<b>Note 8:</b> The BSc in Nursing Studies is a part-time post registration degree for registered nurses and students and are not eligible for the Free Tuition Fees Scheme
