Energy & Utilities



With a campus size of 240,000m². UCC consumes a large amount of energy every year. In fact the College consumes enough energy every year to power 5,500 homes. That's a lot of energy! Through the green campus the college has been making substantial savings in its energy consumption and has achieved a 25% reduction in its energy use since 2008. Over 50% of the electricity consumed on campus is generated on site and the remaining is purchased from renewable sources. This highly valued resource adds significantly to the sense of place and overall setting of the campus. The majestic mature trees frame signature buildings, line avenues and add to the aspiring ambience of the institution which is home to over 2500 trees. The grounds department recognise the unique setting and makeup of the campus gardens and carry out their duties in the most sustainable way possible. Waste from the gardens are collected and used for composting,

while an electric vehicle and battery operated equipment are utilised, where possible, to maintain the gardens. We have recently added a wildflower garden adjacent to the O'Rahilly building and we hope to roll out other initiatives throughout the year as we continue to green our campus.
