What is your long-term professional ambition?

My ambition in 2009:

Secure an academic lecturing position at an Irish University and establish my own research group before I'm 35.

Personal deadline – might have wife, kids, mortgage by then; a somewhat secure job would be nice.

Postdoc = contract-based training position (not secure)

The academic aging process: professional deadlines

Postdoc-land

Year 5: Ineligible for Irish Research Council (IRC) Postdoctoral Fellowships

Year 7: Ineligible for European Research Council (ERC) Starting Grant

Year 8: Ineligible for Science Foundation Ireland (SFI) Starting Investigator Research Grant (2015 call)

Why do a postdoc abroad?

PROFESSIONAL MOTIVATION

- Enhance your academic reputation (quickly!);
 - International network development,
 - Develop highly specialized skills through training not available in Ireland,
 - Increase academic output (journal articles, reviews, conference oral and poster presentations,).

PERSONAL MOTIVATION

- Personal development;
 - Learn a new language, experience a different culture,.....

COLD HARD REALITY

• Facing imminent "academic" unemployment; no obvious positions available in Ireland.

Will any postdoc abroad do?

NO!! Choice of foreign research group is critical.

My ideal postdoc position:

- The most prestigious active group in the field (~20 publications per year);
 - Quality of the group leader
 - Network of the group leader: top-class researchers visit your lab
 - Strong group representation at international conferences (networking)
- A group with a healthy PhD: Postdoc ratio;
 - Supervising perhaps 3 but not 10 PhDs (maintaining high standards)
- Quality of the postdocs;
 - These will be life-long international collaborators (networking)
- Opportunity to write proposals;
 - Learning the soft skills to become independent.


IRC postdoc in NUI Galway vs. postdoc in Switzerland



The Prodigal Son Returns


Reviewers comment from SFI Starting Investigator Research Grant application:

"While the project is surely relevant given its link to the energy problem, it is of a rather fundamental nature. Therefore economic benefits are rather far from now.

However, getting talented scientists like Scanlon back to Ireland is big added value for Ireland, as people like him can likely go to many places within Europe. [I am quite serious about this, and wouldn't normally make such a statement in a review]."



The first independent grant opens many doors




2017: Lecturing position in Department of Chemical Sciences at University of Limerick

Escaping the shadow of your former advisors

- Is your work original?
- How have you demonstrated "independence"?

• Very difficult; catch-22 situation.



The idea of "independence" to proposal reviewers seems massively variable.

Escaping the shadow of your former advisors

ERC reviewer telling me I'm still not showing independence:

- In many publications, the applicant is neither first nor last author, clearly limiting the evidence for his original, creative thinking. Publications in high-impact journals (JACS, Angew. Chem. Int. Ed., Nature journals, Science, PNAS, etc..) are not numerous yet.
- I think the work is interesting and worthwhile to pursue. However, the work is not so different, to my knowledge, with the directions already being pursued by the group of Girault. It would have been nice to indeed see a new "big idea" or high-risk aspect for at least part of this project and this, for me, was missing.

ERC reviewer declaring my independence:

 The PI is an independent researcher and has published more than 30 scientific contributions in very good journals, including Angew. Chem, Adv. Funct. Mat., etc. His track-record clearly shows his ability to lead independently a research group and perform ground-breaking research based on independent thinking.
