





Open Science/ Research / Scholarship



"Open science is an approach based on open cooperative work and systematic sharing of knowledge and tools as early and widely as possible in the process. It has the potential to increase the quality and efficiency of research and accelerate the advancement of knowledge and innovation by sharing results, making them more reusable and improving their reproducibility. It entails the involvement of all relevant knowledge actors" - Horizon Europe

What is open access?

- Open access is a set of principles and practices through which research outputs are distributed online, free of cost or other access barriers.
- Through licensing via an open license (usually a Creative Commons license), freely available outputs can also be legally shared and reused.
- Therefore, open access is more than just free access.

Types of/routes to open access for UCC researchers:

Green OA:

Self-archiving a postprint (AAM) in UCC's Open Access Repository – <u>CORA</u> – in addition to traditional publication in subscription access journal authors deposit a draft copy of their articles (postprint) in an institutional repository e.g. CORA. This may involve a temporary embargo on accessing the full text of article.

Hybrid OA

Publishing in a journal where some articles are published open, because the authors paid the APC fee, while some are behind a paywall because the author did not pay to make it OA

Gold OA:


Articles are made openly accessible by the publisher, often for a fee, known as an article processing charge (APC) which covers publication costs (between €100 - €4k per paper)

Diamond/Platinum OA:

Articles are made openly accessible by the publisher, but no fee is charged to the author. Instead, publication costs are covered by institutions, funders, societies etc. For example:
HRB Open Research">HRB Open Research,
The Boolean">The Open Library of Humanities journal, etc.

CORA - UCC's Open Access Repository - Green OA




Cork Open Research Archive

CORA is University College Cork's online, open access institutional repository, established by UCC Library to collect, store and disseminate the digital research output of the UCC scholarly community.

CORA provides free open access to University College Cork's scholarly and scientific research publications and theses.

When UCC staff or researchers publish a research paper, they should send the authors' accepted manuscript to CORA cora@ucc.ie where we can make it open access.

UCC RESEARCH MASTERS & DOCTORAL THESES



<u>CORA</u> is also the central repository for all UCC postgraduate research theses. While we aim to provide full-text open access, in certain circumstances theses may not have been provided by the graduate or may be embargoed in part or in full.

OA Agreements at UCC

UCC Library is a member of the <u>IReL consortium</u>. IReL has secured agreements with publishers that allow corresponding UCC authors to publish their articles open access with no cost to them. PhD students are eligible!



To avail of IReL funded APCs – applicants must be the **corresponding author** of the paper and must be a staff member or student of UCC at the time the article is **accepted** for publication.



APCs cover the costs of making an article freely available to everyone online, without any paywalls, on the publisher website.

They can be charged by fully Open Access journals or Hybrid journals





IReL Transformative Agreements - IR funding Open Access publishing for UCC authors

- UCC, via IReL have secured several 'Transformative Agreements' with publishers that typically allow corresponding authors from eligible institutions to publish their articles open access immediately on publication. These Article Publishing Charges (APCs) have been prepaid for a large number of articles with a wide range of publishers.
- To confirm if your proposed journal is eligible for a funded APC please check the link below: https://libguides.ucc.ie/OAagreements or email libraryapcs@ucc.ie.
- To avail of funded APCs UCC authors must meet the following criteria, when their article is accepted for publication:
 - You must be listed as the corresponding author.
 - You must include 'University College Cork' in your affiliation details.
 - You should use your UCC email address: @ucc.ie , @tyndall.ie.







APCs covered by IReL Open Access agreements total and per College




