# 1.Activate your IT Account(Email etc.)

To gain access, call the IT Staff Service Desk on 021 4902120 and give them your staff number (found on your contract)

# 2.Activate your Employees Self Service (ESS)

ESS is your portal to apply for leave, view salary payments and access to training.

# 3.Apply for PPS number(for non Irish citizens)

You will need a PPS Number to pay tax. You must have a PPSN number and register your employment in order to avoid Emergency Tax. See <a href="here">here</a> for more details

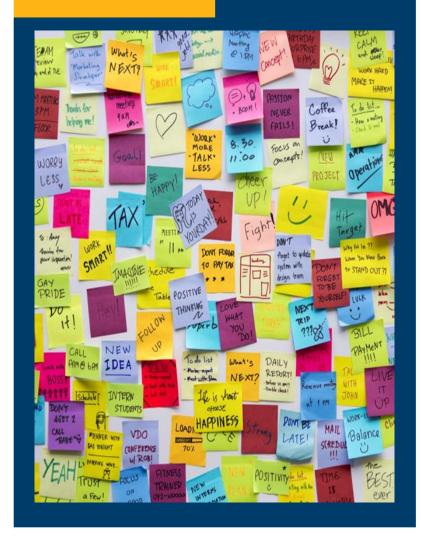
