
## **Case Study Synopsis**

This case study showcases work undertaken as part of the Academic Integrity Project run jointly between the UCC Skills Centre (Kathy Bradley) and the Centre for the Integration of Research, Teaching, and Learning (Dr Catherine O'Mahony), with Dr Loretta Goff as Research Support Officer leading out on the development of educational resources and training opportunities for students and staff. The objective of this project is to foster a culture of academic integrity across UCC through a developmental, whole-institution approach, aligning with the National Academic Integrity Network (NAIN) framework.



#### \* Key Impacts

- Positive framing of academic integrity through fundamental values, aligning with Graduate Attributes.
- Development and delivery of academic integrity workshops through the Skills Centre (~1,500 students engaged to-date, more anticipated in AY 22/23).
- Inter-institutional collaboration with UNIC partner Koç University on a workshop bringing students together for international perspectives (plan to expand this to additional UNIC partners).
- Creation of resources (videos, worksheets, quizzes) to support student success with increased understanding of academic integrity/academic skill development and University supports.
- Academic Integrity Bingo sessions to engage students in a fun way, making the topic more conversational/approachable.
- A professional development opportunity for staff
  through the creation of a new Digital Badge, "Fostering
  Academic Integrity in Learning and Teaching". It
  introduces staff to concepts of academic integrity,
  highlights key points of intervention along the learning
  journey where they can support academic integrity,
  demonstrates how to evaluate reports from textmatching software and use these as a teaching tool,
  explains policies and procedures regarding suspected
  academic misconduct, and showcases resources in UCC
  to use in supporting the development of students'
  academic skills.
- Collaboration with Graduate Attributes to embed academic integrity in the "Integrity" strand of the Your UCC Graduate Attributes and Values Compass, developed in partnership with student Academic Integrity Champions.



## **Intended Changes**

• This initiative intends to increase student and staff support and educational opportunities regarding academic integrity, to encourage reflection on learning enhancement opportunities to support academic integrity, and to highlight the importance of academic integrity across the University, further embedding it into curriculum and across institutional practices (the long-term anticipated impact of this initiative).




#### **Additional Information**
