On production of the completed Dictionary Use Form (see below) the following students are permitted to use a dictionary for non-language examinations.

- 1. Visiting non-degree students, whose vernacular Language is not English, are allowed to use a hard copy language dictionary (Candidate's Language/English + English/Candidate's Language).
- 2. Undergraduate degree students, whose vernacular Language is not English and who enter a UCC degree programme beyond First Year, are allowed to use a hard copy language dictionary (Candidate's Language/English + English/Candidate's Language) for their first year only.

The dictionary must be examined by the invigilator before the examination. Use of electronic dictionaries is not permitted. If unsure of a candidate's eligibility to use a dictionary please contact the Examination Centre.
