## **Know Your Finances**

Starting college is a very exciting time in your life – leaving home, meeting new people, experiencing new things and furthering your education.

Your student experience can be as exciting and adventurous as you want it to



be. It means more freedom and more responsibility in terms of your studies, and also in terms of managing your money. College life can be expensive if you allow it to be, but with good sensible budgeting practices, you can help keep your expenses to a minimum.

**Budgeting** is a simple exercise where you sit down and work out what income you will have over a period of time, such as the academic year, and what costs you will incur in this time. Ideally, you want your income to be greater than costs. If you need assistance there are some handy tips to get you on your way.

**SUSI** is Ireland's national awarding authority for further and higher education grants. **SUSI** offers support to eligible


students in approved courses at PLC, undergraduate and postgraduate levels and in some cases, to students studying outside Ireland


The aim of the Bystander Intervention Programme is to highlight the danger of normalising and accepting abusive behaviour and through education, inform and empower programme participants to better understand their capacity to intervene as pro-social bystanders.

The Bystander Intervention Programme provides students with an understanding of key issues related to consent and the boundaries surrounding sexual assault, rape and abusive relationships. It also enables them to develop key intervention skills which can be utilised in any setting.




**Wi-Fi** Eduroam Wi-Fi is available all across campus. Information on how to register your device can be found on the IT Services web page.


## Skills Centre

#### **Book of Modules**

#### What is the Book Of Modules?

This is referred to as the one-stop-shop for module information at UCC. Any module on offer in the current academic year can be located in the Book of Modules. If you have a question about a module for your specific course, it is almost guaranteed that you can find the answer in there. Every year, over the Summer, UCC produces a provisional Book of Modules, which offers an insight into the modules that will be on offer when the upcoming academic year starts.

Before the Semester begins properly, a finalised Book of Modules will be released - this is the definitive source of information on the modules running during the semester.

#### **Finding the Book Of Modules**

If you plan on using the Book of Modules, you firstly need to be able to find it. Follow <u>this link</u>. to navigate directly to the Book of Modules.


Alternatively, if you want to know exactly where to locate it, follow the below steps.


- 1. Go to www.ucc.ie. and navigate to the 'Courses' tab.
- 2. Select any course from the list, and scroll down through the page.
- 3. Eventually, you will find a link that says 'Book of Modules'. All the course pages are laid out more or less similarly, so this should be true for any course you pick!
- 4. Click on this link to be taken straight to the Book of Modules.

### 4 Tips - The Book Of Modules

Below are 4 essential tips to keep in mind when using the Book of Modules:

- 1. Make sure you keep an eye on the assessment and compulsory elements section of a module's page, and try to pick modules that suit your style of learning and working.
- 2. Familiarise yourself with the Module Content and Learning Outcomes; sometimes modules can have deceptive titles that don't show the full breadth of things covered in the module, not all of which you might be interested in. Similarly, you might find that a module suits you much better than the title led you to believe! It's especially important to check these two sections out for compulsory modules, so you know what you are going to be getting from these.
- 3. Make sure you understand what teaching methods a module uses, so that you can prepare in advance what you will need for the module, and so you know what will be expected from you during your attendance.
- 4. Finally, note down the Module Coordinator's name this is the person you should contact if you have any questions that are not addressed by the Book of Modules.





## Transfers, Plagiarism, and Exam Policies

#### Internal Transfer by application to College/School Office

You can apply to your college office or school/department to change from one course into another within that college/school or to another college or school within the University. This might be changing from Biological and Chemical Sciences into Biological, Earth and Environmental Sciences at the end of first year as you have taken similar modules and want to proceed into a 2nd year stream that is only available in BEES. Information is available by college in the College Calendar.

#### **External Transfers**

An External transfer is someone coming from another University into UCC, to a year beyond first year. A student cannot transfer from outside of UCC into first year, you must apply through the <u>College Admissions Office</u> (<u>CAO</u>). or <u>International Office</u> to receive a first-year placement. # Part 5 Setting Your Goals





This section of The Kit focuses on Goal Setting and the importance of setting goals for yourself throughout your time as a student in UCC. This section can really assist you in your goal setting skills to ensure that you to set yourself up for success in your studies.

To personalise your goals, make sure to engage with the Canvas version of The Kit as there are many interactive videos, templates, and ideas for you to go through. For now, why not take a look at some of our tips for Goal Setting:

- Have a symbol for your goal being achieved: Olympians have medals or Personal Best Times to look at or hold. Graduates have a printed manuscript, a diploma to hang on the wall and photos to take in a cap and gown. Consider what the symbol of your specific goal could be and keep that image in mind.
- Ask for help: The importance of asking for help is essential in building a community and support system to achieve a goal. Asking for help with your goal is a real sign of strength and not weakness.
- Have a why: You can do just about everything once you have a good reason, a good why for doing so. This 'Why' must be personal and internal to you. Find your Why. It is what you can hold onto when things become more difficult or challenging.
- Meaning and Discipline: Motivation can get you to the start line of your goal, but it is meaning and discipline over the long term that ultimately gets a person to the end point. Steady, sustainable progression is what makes this happen.
- Be the Hero in your life: The hero mentality is required to achieve anything so why not be your own personal hero?
