Stillbirths in Ireland

Annual Report 2022



The Irish Stillbirths Registration Act, defines a stillbirth as a child born weighing 500 grammes or more or having a gestational age of 24 weeks or more who shows no sign of life.

Stillbirth rate: Number of stillbirths per 1,000 total births (live births and stillbirths from 24 weeks gestation or weighing >500g).



The stillbirth rate was 3.51 per 1,000 total births



Stillbirth accounted for 66.2% of the perinatal deaths in 2022.

Investigations to determine the cause of death



An **autopsy** was undertaken following 57.8% of stillbirths.



Placental histology examinations were conducted for almost all stillbirths.


Cause of death in stillbirths

Major congenital anomaly was the second most common cause of death in stillbirths in 2022.




