	from the history of German <i>Liebeslyrik</i> , beginning with the medieval Minnesang (Walther von der Vogelweide), <i>Brautmystik</i> (Mechthild von Magdeburg), putting emphasis on <i>Goethezeit</i> , romanticism (cult of friendship and romantic love, e.g. Novalis), 20 th and 21 st century poems (e.g. Erich Fried).

We will pay particular attention to themes, aesthetics, ideologies and impact. We will also examine the legacy of these texts within and beyond the culture and time of their original publication. Description	The module content will explore different forms of resistance in text and in film. We will discuss both individual activists and biographies, and more organised groups who sought to overturn Hitler. Individuals such as Sophie Scholl, who was studying at the University of Munich when she was caught distributing pamphlets written to awaken resistance within the German population, and different groups and voices, including Socialists, Jewish spouses, Communists, various faith-based, and organised military activists will feature in this course. • Continuous Assessment 100 Marks: • Presentation - In-class oral presentation (12-15 minutes) and discussion (40 Marks) • Essay - Written Assignment and Commentary on Bibliography (2,500-3,000 words) (40 Marks) • Attendance & Participation - Attendance and Participation (20 Marks)

Description	Nationalism, it has been argued, is one of only a handful of major discourses that determine the ideological matrix in which modern human existence is embedded. This course will examine the phenomenon of nationalism in the context of Germany, a country with a perhaps uniquely troubled relationship with the concept of identity as determined by nationalist ideology, the troubled relationship serving to magnify tensions that are, of course, inherent in all.

Description	The various memory cultures and memory forms, including individual, collective and communicative memories, are central to a big number of texts which by literary critics have been called 'fictions of memory'. In this seminar we will do a close reading of one prominent example of this literary genre and learn to identify key aspects of it. The textual analysis will be supported by a discussion of various theoretical texts which will inform the students about concepts central to the notion of memory, such as remembering and forgetting, narrative and identity, and space and belonging.

Description	This module explores literary texts and films that chart and reflect upon the recent history of gender relations in German-speaking countries, including emancipatory movements; backlashes; critiques of patriarchy; heteronormativity and gender-based violence. Consulting theoretical and literary key texts and diverse voices from c. 1890 to the present day, we investigate literature and film as modes of reflection and critique which portray, contest and re-imagine the distribution of social and symbolic power within sex-gender systems.

Description	The aim of the seminar is to give students an overview of German history, culture and society after the Second World War, based on presentations and the discussion of various (literary and/or theoretical) texts, media and film. The seminar will focus on aspects of life in divided Germany and the effects unification continues to have on individuals and on society as a whole. Further cultural issues that influence contemporary Germany, such as the women's movement or remembering Germany's colonial past, will also be discussed. The seminar is also designed to prepare students for their year abroad by familiarizing them with a range of key issues in contemporary German culture.
